Peace Cranes is a monumental exhibition featuring an installation of 140,000 origami paper cranes of peace and hope by Scottish artist Janis Hart. The installation will span the entire heritage space of St John's Church, Edinburgh. This vast number represents not only the victims of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima in 1945 but the lives lost in the UK to the global COVID-19 pandemic, as well as the great acceleration of species extinction through the symbol of the endangered red-crowned crane.

The exhibition will explore the twin existential threats of nuclear weapons, and the climate and ecological emergencies by using the dual power of contemporary public art and the peace movement. It will be free to attend and open to all from 6 August until 28 August 2021 as part of Just Festival – Edinburgh's social justice and human rights festival, which has been an important part of the Edinburgh International Fringe Festival for over twenty years.


CROWDFUND WITH US
